### The Big Flush of 2019

A very wet winter, spring, and early summer has kept water flows rapidly from a trickle to a torrent. through the Cypress River Basin higher than normal for the entire All of this complex hydrology has kept lots of water moving

year to date.

The basin includes the Little Cypress, Black Cypress, Big Cypress, and various smaller creeks along with the lakes shown in the table, all of which are man-made water storage reservoirs, except for Caddo Lake, which is Cypress River Basin Lakes semi-natural. Some of the lakes have gated spillways, so flow into the Big Cypress can be moderated to some Lake Gilmer extent, but the Black Johnson Creek Reservoir Cypress and Little Cypress Monticello Reservoir reservoirs to act as buffers, Welsh Reservoir so when a big rain occurs, Lake O' The Pines their flows can change Caddo Lake

through Caddo Lake. Anyone trying to navigate their boat into a boat house on the river above the big lake knows how swift the current has been. But that swift current has washed a lot of giant salvinia over the dam at Mooringsport into the Red River. resulting in a lake with lots of open water this summer. There is some crested floating heart in some areas, but it doesn't grow as fast as the giant salvinia, nor does it prevent boat navigation.




There are a few backwater areas with salvinia, however, and the Caddo Biocontrol Alliance and TPWD continue to monitor these areas closely.

Some charts have been included below which show how the water flow has varied through the year to date from the Lake O' the Pines dam and through the Big Cypress above State Highway flooding. Caddo peaked at nearly eight feet above normal, also 43, after the Little Cypress and Black Cypress contribute their flows. The peak flow this year was over 18,000 cfs on May 13. Also on page 3 is a chart showing the deviation from normal pool level for both Lake O' the Pines and Caddo Lake. Lake O' the Pines peaked at over 11 feet above normal, closing most of the recreational facilities there, and sparing Caddo from much worse

closing down facilities and keeping some residents from getting to their homes by car.

The gates at Lake O' the Pines finally began closing around July 25, and water flow through Caddo Lake will be rapidly decreasing barring a new hurricane inspired monsoon event.
